Wow can you believe that the first quarter of 2024 is almost over? As usual we have been very busy.


January began with our first membership meeting of 2024, where 3 of our new members were presented their certificate of membership.

HOMER G. Phillips Hospital



Our Second Act members attended The History of Homer G. Phillips Hospital resented at Barnes Jewish College/ Gold Farb School of Nursing in honor of Black History Month. Candace O'Connor, author of "Climbing the Ladder-Chasing the Dream" presented the story of Homer G. Phillips Hospital. Homer G Phillips was the only public hospital for African Americans in St. Louis, Missouri from 1937 until 1955, when the city began to desegregate. It continued to operate, and to serve the Black community of St. Louis until its closure in 1979. Oral stories and memories from nurses who

HEALTHY LIFESTYLE

Colorectal cancer is the third leading cause of death from cancer in the United States.

Between 2011 and 2019, the number of new colorectal cancer cases in the United States decreased slightly per year in people aged 50 years and older but increased slightly per year in people younger than 50 years. For the past 20 years, the rate of deaths from colorectal cancer has been decreasing in both men and women. The number of new cases and the number of deaths is higher in Black people compared with other races; however, studies have found no evidence that Black people have higher rates of precancerous lesions. Finding and treating colorectal cancer early may prevent death from colorectal cancer. Screening tests may be used to help find colorectal cancer.

The following risk factors increase the risk of colorectal cancer:

Age, Family history of colorectal cancer, Personal history, Inherited risk

Alcohol, Cigarette smoking, Race, Obesity

The following protective factors decrease the risk of colorectal cancer:

Physical activity, Aspirin, Combination hormone replacement therapy, Polyp removal


